Times of the School Day

School has always finished at 3.15pm for all children but this was changed during COVID to allow for a staggered end and start to the day for everyone's safety. We are now ready to go back to normal timings of the school day:



Reception, KS1 and KS2

8.55am- registration (doors open 8.45am)

There will be a soft start to the morning. Children can enter school from 8.45am to 8.55am and complete wellbeing activities. The school day starts at 8.55am and children must be in school by this time.

3.15pm End of the day

30 hours- 8.45-3.15pm

15 hours am- 8.45 - 11.45am

15 hours pm- 12.15pm-3.15pm



To start our year, all year groups are finding out more about animals, including humans. The children have enjoyed their topic so far and are looking forward to finding out more! Here's what the children will be learning:

EYFS are vets!	Linking in with 'Understanding the World' the children will iden- tify and name some common animals.		
Year 1 are zoologists!	The children will name various parts of the body and find out more about carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.		
Year 2 become wildlife biologists!	Year 2 scientists will find out about animals' young, what they need to survive and the importance of staying clean.		
Year 3 are orthopaedic doctors!	The children will classify animals by what they eat, find out more about nutrition and the human skeleton.		
Year 4 are dentists!	Year 4 will explore the human digestive system and become Lingey Dentists, finding out more about teeth.		
Year 5 are mammal midwives!	The children will learn about the different gestation periods of different mammals, find out more about how a foetus develops and will describe the changes as humans develop to old age.		
Year 6 are cardiolo- gists!	Year 6 will find out more about the human circulatory system and will explore the differences between aerobic and anaerobic exercises.		

NewsWise Project

Our Year 6 children are beginning an exciting new project next week! We have partnered with The Guardian newspaper and are taking part in their 'NewsWise' project where they will be learning the tricks of the trade.



Over the next three weeks, the children will be partaking in a series of workshops with real-life journalists before reporting on real news themselves!

The parental consent forms were handed out before the summer holidays and the majority of children are already signed up.

Reception

Our Reception children have started phonics lessons this week, a key foundation in their reading journey. We use the systematic Sounds-Write phonics scheme, which has multi-sensory lessons to enable children to embed the skills of segmenting, blending and phoneme manipulation. The sounds we will focus on this half term, are sounds which can be represented by spellings with one letter. For example /a/ as in mat and /n/ as in pin. Keep an eye out on Facebook and Seesaw for further updates.

The children have also enjoyed staying for school dinners this week and have shown great independence when choosing their meals and cleaning their plates afterwards. It's been lovely to have the whole classes in together this Friday, the children have really enjoyed making new friends and seeing familiar faces.

Nursery

Due to the interest in our creative table, we are asking for any donations of materials for Nursery. Possible item ideas are egg boxes, bottles, kitchen roll tubes, cardboard boxes, bottle lids and wrappers. We ask that they are cleaned and free of food residue due to allergies.

PE Kits

During COVID, children began coming into school in their PE kits on their PE days. This has had a positive impact:

- no time is wasted in getting changed
- children do not need to worry about getting changed in front of others
- children with sensory issues to not need to change or put back on clothing e.g. socks

Therefore, we have decided that children will continue to come into school on PE days in their PE kit (see timetable below).

PE kit consists of:

- plain white t-shirt or polo shirt
- navy joggers or shorts
- navy school sweatshirt
- plain black trainers

NO LOGOS OR FOOTBALL KITS TO BE WORN. We have taken a more relaxed approach to this in the past year but now we are doing this longer term, we need to ensure that agreed PE kit is worn. If children come to school in incorrect PE kits,

parents will be contacted.

Homework

Children in Years 1-6 will have a homework task set on Seesaw tonight. There will be a variety of activities for children to complete over the half term linked to one of their current topics. There will be activities from many different subjects to offer a wide variety of interests. Children can complete as many as these as they choose and will receive house tokens at the end of the half term. Photos, videos, writing, drawing or physical projects are all welcome. These can be shared on Seesaw or if it is a bigger project (often art based) we would love children to bring them into school to share with their class, this can be done at any point throughout the half term.


10p Book Sale

Spelling and Accelerated Reading

Over the last week, the children in Years 2-6 have been busy taking their Star Reader tests; these determine their reading age and which levels of Accelerated Reading books will best help them progress. There are hundreds of new books for them to choose from and take quizzes on in our beautiful libraries - but reading doesn't have to just be in school! Lots of children read avidly at home and have asked if they can take AR quizzes outside of school. In order to do this, they need to access our special AR website link which is:

card which has their unique Accelerated Reader login details on as well as their Spelling Shed username and password. They should also have a reading record which will be stamped in school when they are heard reading by and adult. Please continue to write in them as you always have - reading at home makes a huge difference to their fluency and understanding.



This year, we have signed up to Spelling Shed who have launched an amazing new scheme. Each week, the children from Years 4-6 will continue using and applying their phonics knowledge to split words into syllables and improve their spellings (children in the other year groups are following the Sounds Write scheme). One of the best features of Spelling Shed is their amazing games! They allow children to practise speed and accuracy as well as earn points to upgrade their accounts. Each week, your child's teacher will set a word list on their Spelling Shed account which can then be practised using these games. This is not compulsory as the teaching of spelling is thorough within school but it's a great fun

and interactive way to commit spelling patterns to memory. The children's logins will be issued by their class teacher shortly on the same card as their Accelerated Reading logins.



Attendance

Each week, the class with the best attendance will have an extra 10 minutes of playtime. If any class has 100% attendance, they will have an ice cream playtime!


