# Message from Northumbria Police

#### Key Messages

Sadly a 14-year-old boy has died following a suspected assault.

He has now been named as Tomasz Oleszak from Gateshead.

Please respect his family's privacy.

We have arrested a teenager on suspicion of murder. He remains in police custody.

Officers remain in the area to carry out a range of enquiries and offer reassurance to the public.

Given the age of the people involved, we ask that the public do not speculate on details of the investigation. What might seem like an innocent post on social media to you, could in reality disrupt an on-going investigation and cause unnecessary upset to the family of the victim.

If you do know something, please come directly to officers.

Thank you so much for the support you have already given officers - the community have really rallied.

We would ask that anybody who has any information, please let us know.

Anyone with information is asked to contact police via the 'Tell Us Something' page of our website or by calling 101.

# Holidays During Term Time

Attendance Matters!



Every Student, Every School, Every Day Lingey House Primary School is committed to maximising the potential of every child. You too want the very best for your child therefore good, consistent attendance at school is crucial to give your child the best chance of success.

We need your support in ensuring that holidays are not taken in school time so that your child has the very best opportunity to succeed.

Our attendance target is 96% for this academic year.

Head Teachers are not able to grant any leave of absence for holidays during term time unless there are proven exceptional circumstances. Therefore, as a school we have adopted a standard practice of not authorising any family holidays in term time. This is in line with government guidelines and the local authority. If parents/carers, contrary to what the school has said, still decide to take their child out of school for a holiday then the absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

If you wish to make an application for your child's term time leave of absence, you must fill out an application form, which can be requested from the school office. The application form asks you to outline the reasons why you feel your application for leave of absence during term time should be regarded as 'exceptional'. Following the submission of your application, you will be notified as soon as possible of the school's decision.

Parent/carers should be aware that if you take leave of absence during term time without making a prior application to the school, or if you make an application but your requested leave of absence is not authorised and still take your child out of school, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised. Similarly, if you keep your child away from school for longer than agreed/authorised, the excess absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

Unauthorised absences on your child's attendance record may mean that you are liable to incur a Fixed Penalty Notice or could face prosecution. A fixed penalty notice will be issued to each person with parental responsibility for the child/children who is deemed liable for the offence/offences.

## 1-2-3 Magic

The 1-2-3 Magic programme is designed to help support families on how to manage challenging behaviour. In partnership with the Early Help Service, we will be offering a programme for families with children between the ages of 2 and 12.

MAGIC

The programme will run Monday 17<sup>th</sup> October 2022, 9.00-11.15. This programme

is a simple and effective way of managing your child's behaviour. You will be given information on:

- Controlling unwanted behaviour
- Encouraging positive behaviour
- Strengthening your relationship

## Earrings in school

In the interests of safety, jewellery should not be worn in school. This includes earrings. As we have introduced OPAL into school, playtimes are much more adventerous and we don't want anyone becoming hurt because of the jewellery they are wearing. We ask that children do not wear earrings for school.

Autumn term - a phone consultation with the class teacher

Spring term - a Face to Face consultation and opportunity to look at children's books

Summer term - a full written report (you'll be able to make an appointment to discuss this if you wish)




We are delighted to offer a wide range of after school clubs this half term. The clubs run from 3.15-4.15pm and are FREE OF  $\it CHARGE$ .




Dancing at the Eagles


