Times Table Rockstars

The ability to recall multiplication facts fluently enables children to access many other areas of the maths curriculum with ease and it is an expectation that by the end of Year 4, all children should know times tables facts up to 12 x 12. The children at LHPS are taught times tables in school and KS2 children are given the opportunity to practise using Times Table Rock Stars – a web-based programme – to consolidate their knowledge. We actively encourage KS2 children to continue this learning at home and find some time to practise by logging in to www.ttrockstars.com or by downloading the app for free to a mobile device. Each week, the three children who have earned the most coins for the previous 7 days and who have improved their personal studio speed will be celebrated in assembly and receive a certificate! In addition, the class with the highest average number of minutes played per player will receive the golden guitar to display in their classroom for that week. EYFS update



Change of clothes

An important part of the Early Years curriculum is indoor and outdoor learning. We ask that you ensure your child has a change of clothes in school at all times. We have spare clothes in school but have found that they are not being returned. The change of clothes do not need to be school uniform and are there to ensure your child does not have to wear ill-fitting or wet clothes for the remainder of the day. This is particularly important if your child has any sensory issues related to clothes as we cannot always find clothes to suit their needs. We ask that you check over the weekend for any clothes or underwear that you think may belong to school.

Wellies & Coats

As the colder weather draws in, could we ask that all children have a **pair of wellies** in school and a **warm coat**, to participate in outdoor learning. Please ensure your child's name is inside! If you would like some support with this, please contact Hannah, our family support worker.

Promoting Independence

An important factor within the Early Years is promoting your child's independence to allow them to flourish. This also means your child will not be missing out on key learning opportunities. If you would like advice on how to support your child, please speak to an adult on the door.

This half term we have been working on:

- Toileting and hand washing
- Tidying up after themselves
- Putting on coats, wellies and shoes and clothes
- Recognising their own name.
