# Holidays During Term Time





Every Student, Every School, Every Day Lingey House Primary School is committed to maximising the potential of every child. You too want the very best for your child therefore good, consistent attendance at school is crucial to give your child the best chance of success.

We need your support in ensuring that holidays are not taken in school time so that your child has the very best opportunity to succeed.

## Our attendance target is 96% for this academic year.

Head Teachers are not able to grant any leave of absence for holidays during term time unless there are proven exceptional circumstances. Therefore, as a school we have adopted a standard practice of not authorising any family holidays in term time. This is in line with government guidelines and the local authority. If parents/carers, contrary to what the school has said, still decide to take their child out of school for a holiday then the absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

If you wish to make an application for your child's term time leave of absence, you must fill out an application form, which can be requested from the school office. The application form asks you to outline the reasons why you feel your application for leave of absence during term time should be regarded as 'exceptional'. Following the submission of your application, you will be notified as soon as possible of the school's decision.

Parent/carers should be aware that if you take leave of absence during term time without making a prior application to the school, or if you make an application but your requested leave of absence is not authorised and still take your child out of school, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised. Similarly, if you keep your child away from school for longer than agreed/authorised, the excess absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

Unauthorised absences on your child's attendance record may mean that you are liable to incur a Fixed Penalty Notice or could face prosecution. A fixed penalty notice will be issued to each person with parental responsibility for the child/children who is deemed liable for the offence/offences.



# <u>Reporting to parents- finding out how</u> your <u>child is getting on this year!</u>

This year, we will report to parents in the following way: Autumn term - a phone consultation with the class teacher Spring term - a Face to Face consultation and opportunity to look at children's books

Summer term - a full written report (you'll be able to make an appointment to discuss this if you wish)

Telephone consultations will take place in week beginning 7<sup>th</sup>

November - more details to follow regarding the day for each year group and how to book your telephone appointment.

The children in EYFS have been observing signs of Autumn all around them.

In Nursery, the children have been on a listening autumn walk around the school grounds and looked for changes around them. With the autumn treasures we found, the children have enjoyed using their senses to explore and create autumnal art. We have also been learning about harvest time and explored different vegetables. We have used them to make our own vegetable soup and create artwork by stamping them. Thank you for donations to our snack fund; we have used it to buy ingredients to make our soup.



We have also been inspired by Yayoi Kasuma, who has had an exhibition at Tate Modern. We have used different shaped and coloured stickers to create

> our own contemporary pumpkin art!

In Reception, the children have sketched pumpkins, printed in autumnal colours, observed and discussed natural Autumn objects and have created shapes in maths with Autumn twigs. As part of English, the children have also started a new text, 'Stanley's Stick'.

#### **Reception Reading Books**

The children in Reception will start taking reading books home within the next few weeks. These books are closely linked to our phonics scheme and will reflect the sounds your child has been learning.

### <u>BookTrust Gifts</u>

BookTrust is the UK's largest children's reading charity. This year, they will be sending 'Time to Read' packs to our school. *Every child in Reception at Lingey House will receive a pack*. Each pack includes a charming story to read together, with simple text and bold illustrations. Booktrust want to make sure that every Reception pupil in England has their own book to treasure and share with their family at home. As soon as we have more information about scheduled delivery dates, our Reception team would love to arrange a 'Story Session' with families. This would include a member of your family coming into our Reception class and sharing a story with your child.
