NEU Industrial Action – Further Strike Days

As I am sure you are aware, teacher members of the National Education Union (NEU) have voted to carry out industrial action and have announced their intention to further strike.



They have named the following dates as planned strike days for our region: Thursday 27th April 2023, Tuesday 2nd May 2023

Many of our teachers are in the NEU and plan to follow their union's advice to strike.

I can confirm that on the above two dates, our school will be partially closed as follows:

Nursery (30 hours and 15 hours) – Closed YRA and YRB - Closed Y1A and Y1B – Closed Y2A and Y2B – Open – Y2 children to attend as usual Y3A and Y3B – Open – Y3 children to attend as usual Y4A and Y4B – Closed Y5A and Y5B – Closed Y6A and Y6B – Open – Y6 children to attend as usual

Please note that unlike on previous strike days, Y6A and Y6B are to attend school as usual.

I understand that this will cause disruption to children and parents and that many of you will have to make alternative childcare arrangements. However, the decision to strike has not been taken lightly by our teachers. The NEU are planning more days of industrial action later in the term- they plan to confirm these on 18th May. Once I have further information about these dates and staff's intentions on these dates, I will inform you. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

<u>Baby and Toddler Group – spread the</u> word!

Our baby and toddler group ran by Hannah (our family support worker) and Early Years staff will start on Monday 15th May – in the Lodge.

Until we can identify the interest in our group, we will be limiting this to siblings of our pupils but will open this to the wider community if spaces are available.

Out of School Achievements

Congratulations to Jace (Y1), Benjamin (Y2) and Annabelle (Y4) for their achievements at the Adventurer Bible Experience where they were chosen to represent the Newcastle team as part of a group of 6 children called the **Pacesetters** from Newcastle! They have been preparing for the last six months for these Christian studies tests and their hard work has most definitely paid off.

- In January, they competed at District level and came first place out of 12 teams.
- In February, they competed against 30 teams at Area level and came 2nd.
- In March, they competed against 60 teams at National level and gained first position, sharing it with 4 other strong teams.
- 15th April they were chosen to represent the United Kingdom at the TransEuropean Divisional (TED) level that was held in Athens, Greece.

At this TED level, they got to meet with other Adventurer teams from 22 European countries (Albania, Bosnia-Herzegovina, the Channel Islands, Croatia, Cyprus, Denmark, Estonia, Faeroe Islands, Finland, Greece, Greenland, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Isle of Mann, Latvia, Lithuania, Macedonia, Montenegro, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Serbia, Slovenia, Sweden and the UK). They were up against 45 teams and were one of the four winning teams! They made a perfect score of 100% and earned the most "well behaved" team in the entire competition.

Well done Jace, Benjamin and Annabelle- we are so proud of you!




