Good luck Mrs Baggott!


World Book Day Week!


















School Football Team




Lost Property

OPAL - Rough and Tumble Play

As part of OPAL staff and children are exploring many different styles of play and participating in training. This week children have been looking at rough and tumble play in assembly where they have discussed different ideas about what this entails and shared suggestions about how to keep safe whilst engaging in rough and tumble play. This included discussing play cues and knowing when other children no longer wanted to take part. Play ambassadors have had further training today and agreed on the rules to keep everyone safe.

What does rough and tumble play look like?

- Tests of strength
- Physical contact games
- Wrestling
- Playful pushing and jostling

What are our rules for keeping safe?



- Rough and tumble only on soft areas with an open space (spare clothes needed or keep off the mud)
- Stop when the other person has had enough
- Be aware of your own and other people's strength (it should not hurt!)

OPAL - We need wheels!

As we continue our OPAL journey, we are looking to expand upon what we already have available for the children. Since we have had to intervene (a few times) in the children pushing each other around in our wheeled boxes we use for storage, we think that our next area will have to be dedicated to WHEELS!

For the children, that feeling of moving at speed with the wind in your face is exhilarating! This type of play benefits our children in more ways than you would think. It improves their fine and gross motor skills; helps improve co-ordination and balance and it is loads of fun.

Like all of the areas we have created so far, we will undertake an initial risk benefit assessment through the help of our amazing OPAL ambassadors. This will allow us to fully measure the risks and understand the best way to approach the creation of our wheeled zone.

This is the part where **we need your help!** Having already done a little research into wheel zones (in other OPAL schools) we have identified a list of items that would be fantastic to use in our wheel zone, to give the children the best possible experience.

If anybody has any of the following lying around unused, we would greatly appreciate any donations:


- Wheelbarrows


