#### **Stay And Play**






## WhatsApp Groups – This problem is still ongoing!

We have been made aware that a large number of children in our Year 5 and 6 classes are part of a group WhatsApp group. Whilst this is something that we don't want to discourage as it helps the children to socialize, there have several reports of inappropriate content being shared in these groups, including sexual content, discussion of drugs, foul language, saying unkind things about children in the group, blocking children from the group and using names and images of Lingey House staff. While this is something that is happening outside of school, we have a duty of care to our children and staff and we urge parents/carers to check their child's phone activity.

A huge well done to ... Chloe in Y5B

Congratulations to Chloe who achieved 4 swimming medals at the Northumberland and Durham Championships in February. She won a silver medal for 50m free-style, coming in at 32.94 seconds.
