#### Opal - How do we tackle issues like the mud in school?

This week in school we have been addressing the mud. It is quite literally everywhere. We know that at the time the children may be having lots of fun but the cleaning side of things... is not fun.

We began our Opal journey just over a year ago. We recall that at this time last year, we had a similar issue with the mud. However, this time around we have more in place than we previously did.



Firstly, we now have weekly assemblies! These play a huge part in assessing the way we manage Opal. Most importantly, our assemblies give the whole school time to discuss with the children and staff, any important topics and feedback we may have. Just like the MUD!

This week in assembly we reviewed our muddy rules; we looked at some videos and pictures of our very own muddy play and agreed as a whole school how much mud is too much mud. Below are a couple example slides from this week's assemblies!

It may seem like a while ago that wellies were the first major introduction to the school uniform, however it's just become part of outdoor life now at playtimes. Children know that to access certain areas, they must have their wellies!





We also now have waterproofs! The wet weather cloakroom is always open at lunch time and our children can access it freely, with an array of waterproof suits and pants as well as spare wellies for them to wear.

We aren't finished there though. We understand that, although we may be a platinum Opal school, it doesn't mean we are perfect. We believe we are still only in the early stages and we still have lots of learning to do. However, through learning what works and what doesn't, we will become even better!

#### Nursery

#### **EYFS Updates**

• **Doctors -** We have a doctors role play in Nursery. If anyone has any leaflets, bandages, boxes, prescription boxes and bags not being used, we would love to add them to our doctor's surgery.

• **Catalogues and Magazine –** If you see any food or toy catalogues whilst shopping in supermarkets, we would be grateful if you could pick up some for EYFS please.

• **XMAS Decorations -** If anyone has any spare decorations, especially baubles, EYFS would love to have them.

• Christmas Stay and Play - Nursery Stay and Play will take place on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> December from 9-11am for all 15-hour AM/PM and 30-hour children. Children are welcome to stay until the end of the session or can be taken home with their adults.

• **Labels** - Thank you for naming and labelling all items of clothing. Please continue to do this so that we can return any lost items.

• **Library –** Nursery library books are to be returned every Thursday ready to be changed and handed out again on a Friday.

• **Returning Clothes -** A reminder to please return any spare clothes which your child has borrowed from school's stock, especially socks and underwear.

• **Updates** - Please remember to check Seesaw every week for homework tasks and photos of your children. We would be grateful if you could upload photos of your child completing activities they enjoy doing at home. This allows us to share them together with their friends.

• **Bags** - Please could you ensure your child has a bag which is left in school (can be a carrier bag) with multiple spare clothes (tops, bottoms, underwear and socks). This is beneficial if children are engaging in messy play and need a change of clothes. Thank you!

• **Clothes –** Any donations of spare children's clothes would be extremely welcome for us to use in school.

• **Bikes/Scooters –** We would like to remind parents not to let children/siblings ride around on bikes or scooters in the EYFS outdoor areas. For health and safety reasons, bikes and scooters should be dismounted on arrival at the school gates.

• **Snack Money –** Thank you to those parents who are donating towards our voluntary snack money each week. This enables nursery staff to cook with the children and provide additional snacks. Donations from as little as 50p per week can be given to staff on the nursery door.

• **Recycling –** We need the following items for our junk modelling: boxes, tubs, kitchen roll tubes, bottle tops, cake trays and bottles. We would be grateful for any donations you can provide. Thank you.

• **Lost Property –** Some children are missing bobble hats and cardigans in nursery and some of these items have named labels. We know that children often have the same or similar items of clothing so can we ask parents to check that they have the correct ones at home.
