Equality and diversity are central in our whole school curriculum. To further develop knowledge and understanding, enhancing what we already do in school, we are excited to be working with Show Racism the Red Card. On Friday 19th January there will be an assembly for years 1-6, followed by workshops for years 4-6 and also some professional development for school staff.

Aims:

- A better understanding of racism and how it impacts on -individuals and society.
- An increased understanding of how to recognise and respond to racism in a safe way.
- An increased awareness of critical thinking and its usefulness in challenging stereotypes and recognising media bias.
- A better understanding of appropriate/inappropriate terminology relating to ethnicity.

<u>Opal Refresh</u>

Happy new year everyone! It seems like 5 minutes ago we were breaking up for Christmas, or perhaps it feels longer depending on how hyper your children were over the two-week break...

Here we are again though, back to school and back with another opal newsletter. However not everything is the same, with the new year comes new challenges and avenues to explore!

A few changes here and there

This week we took the opportunity to reflect on our breaktimes and thought of quick fixes to improve our play. We agreed that morning break was a little boring, sounds harsh but it's true. You will all know far too well but if something is not to a child's liking they won't hold back! So, it's time to make a change. We want to ensure that our children are reaping the rewards of play time no matter how

little time they have. So... "Open the sandpit, get out the loose parts, let's get out there and have an amazing play time!". Initially we only had Opal Lunch times due to morning break being so short but by making a few quick changes to our play provision we have now made the areas more accessible.

Recharging our imaginations

In assembly this week we continued our theme of reviewing opal in its current state and a topic of conversation was that our loose parts area was in need of a little refreshing. So, we strategically chose 3 sets of equipment and grabbed some volunteers from the audience. Their task was to build whatever they could think of within 2 minutes with their items. Whilst the rest of the children

watched, they had to think of what they could make with each set of equipment. The creations that the children made were excellent: we

had an ice cream shop; a block tower for mini figures and a ball slide. What was even more amazing was what the children in the audience thought up, with their ideas being completely different to the ones building. The ice cream shop could have been constructed into an obstacle course (mentioned one child). Another said the blocks from the tower could have been used as a game of

Jenga. The possibilities really were endless. It shows that sometimes all it takes is just a little bit of inspiration for our children and their amazing imaginations will run wild!

Just look at what some of our children created in the morning break straight after assembly, **the world's largest marble run**!

<u>Reading</u>

Library Books - Nursery library books should be returned every Thursday, ready to be changed and handed out again on a Friday. Please see Seesaw for details of arrangements for changing library books in our reception classes.

Reading Books - The children in our reception classes are provided with a reading book and reading record to support their Phonics development. These should be brought into school every day. Please see Reception staff with any questions you may have regarding Phonics. **Other Updates Seesaw** - Please remember to check Seesaw every week for homework tasks and photos of your children. We would be grateful if you could upload photos of your child completing activities that they enjoy doing at home. This allows us to share these activities with your child and their friends.

Donations of the following items would be greatly appreciated:

- **Recycling** We need boxes, tubs, kitchen roll tubes, bottle tops, cake trays, bottles for our junk modelling.
- **Birds** Yogurt pots, egg boxes, kitchen roll tubes and pines cones please get collecting so we can use these to make our bird feeders!
- Sweet Wrappers Please keep any brightly coloured sweet wrappers you may have at Christmas for us to use in our craft area.
- Winter Walks Please look out for stones, pebbles, pine cones, leaves, sticks, fir tree branches etc whilst out on your travels. We would like these items to enhance our mud kitchen and playdough areas.
- **Baby Items** We are collecting the following baby accessories e.g. nappies, bottles, rattles, baby dishes/spoons, empty wipe packets, talc bottles, sudocrem bottles etc.
- **Mud Kitchen** We would like old spoons, whisks, ladles, baking trays, tins, pots and pans, jugs, and measuring cups to use in our cooking area.
- Snack money Thank you to all parents who are giving towards our voluntary snack money each week. The money collected allows us to cook with the children and buy additional snacks for them. Donations from as little as 50p per week would be most welcome and can be handed to staff at the nursery door.
- **Clothes** Any donations of spare children's clothes would be extremely welcome for us to add to our school stock. The current weather means that children are needing to be changed more often than usual in particular SOCKS!

Reminders:

- **Returning Clothes** A reminder to please return any spare clothes which your child has borrowed from school's stock, especially socks and underwear.
- Lost Property Some children are missing bobble hats, cardigans and other items from nursery. These items have named labels. We know that children often have the same or similar items of clothing so can we ask all parents to check that they have the correct clothing at home.
- **Bikes** We would like to remind parents NOT to allow children/siblings to ride around on bikes or scooters in the EYFS outdoor areas. For health and safety reasons, all bikes and scooters should be dismounted on arrival at the school gates.
- Please check seesaw weekly for updates on news, homework and what your child has been doing at school.
