Our scientists in Year 4 have been learning about the digestive system, using tights to model the journey our food takes.



The clear plastic bag represents the stomach which is a large muscular sac that contains hydrochloric acid. It is able to churn the food, mixing it with the acid so that it can be broken down into even smaller molecules.

The food is then poured into the tights, this represents the small intestine inside the body. This is where the nutrients from the food we have eaten is absorbed.



The last stage of digestion involves the large intestine that absorbs water and any remaining nutrients from the small intestine. Once this has been done the waste products are then excreted from the body as faeces.

If you'd like to complete this experiment at home, BBC Bitesize has a great set of instructions, informative video and equipment list.





Reception

In Reception this week, the children have continued to work hard during their phonics lessons and have even 'played phonics' during their time in continuous provision. We started a new story this week, which we'll base some of our learning on, The Colour Monster. Next week, we will continue to explore the range of feelings presented in the book, as well as our own feelings. As part of a maths challenge this



week, the children were all asked to find two matching items in class. We had everything from Numicon and compare bears to socks and forks! The children were able to justify why their items matched and could explain why some didn't. Outside, the children have created mudball cakes, worked together to "put out a huge fire", rescued worms and continued to enjoy our wide variety of dressing up outfits.

We are delighted to offer a wide range of after school clubs this half term. These will start next week and run 3.15-4.15pm. All clubs will be FREE OF CHARGE.


