Curriculum Update – EYFS

Nursery - Nursery have had a fantastic few weeks settling into their school life, making friends, following new routines and trying very hard to build up their own independence. We have spent a long time exploring our environment, finding out what we enjoy and listening to stories and songs. Nursery are enjoying taking responsibility in self-serving their own snack during provision time as well as finding



their own names at self-registration time.

This week, we have enjoyed drawing our own self-portraits, thinking about what we look like, describing our features and talking about how we are different. We have created our very own hairdressers in Nursery, which the children have loved exploring. We have been choosing our favourite hairstyles and colours before making appointments with the receptionist.



Home Learning: We are looking at our different families next week, please can you send in your photos on Seesaw to talk about. If you would like to, you can create an artwork piece of your family, this could be with paints, pens, nature or even loose parts!

Reception - Reception have settled into school very well. They have loved seeing friends from nursery and making brand new friends in their class! This week we began teaching 'drawing club' sessions where we focus on a story for a week and look closely at the characters and settings. This week our book has been 'The colour monster goes to school.' Our drawing club brings books alive and we have had so much joy and happiness from adventuring into stories.

We've had a lot of wet weather over the past week and many of our children have needed to be changed out of wet clothes. Because of this we're running low on spare clothes in school.
