



The following procedures will be carried out by office staff when we do not hear from Parents/Carers in order to comply with our Safeguarding policy:




Coffee Morning

Reading & Library Book Amnesty



Household Support Fund

The Household Support Fund (HSF) is a government scheme. £3.6m is available to support Gateshead households in the most need up to 31 March 2024.

- we have funds available
- your household is in need of support
- you fit the other criteria for the application process at the time

Reminders

Updates- please remember to check seesaw weekly for homework tasks and photos of your children. Remember to upload photos of your child at home doing things they enjoy; this way we can share them together with their friends. We use seesaw as a communication and language tool to support children's confidence and language of talking about things that are important to them.

Library books – please can all Nursery parents return library books on a Thursday to be changed and returned on a Friday.

Praise notes from home- if you have achievements from home that you want to share with us, praise notes are available from your child's classroom door- just ask!

Well done, Yazan.






A huge well done to... **Myla!**
