Show Racism the Red Card

We have enjoyed working with Show Racism the Red Card charity today, starting with a fun assembly including a story called 'Something Else'. This helped us to learn about treating everyone kindly and why it's so important. We discussed how we can all be different but still have lots in common and explored how it feels to be treated differently. The children listened so well and discussed how what racism is and how racist incidents can be aimed at people's nationality, skin colour or religion. Children had some fantastic questions! Year 4 and Year 6 took part in some workshops too; we will share more information about these sessions next week. Unfortunately, the Year 5 workshop has had to be postponed but this will go ahead at a later date.

Stay & Play Phonics Reception

Thank you to all the parents/carers who were able to attend the Stay & Play. We hope you all enjoyed it and found this informative so that this helps with supporting phonics at home. We look forward to seeing you all again at the next Stay & Play!













Reminders:

- Nursery Door On a morning and collection, can all parents/carers please remember to queue. Please wait until the person in front of you has come into Nursery, we want drop off to be as smooth as possible. This will allow us to attend to each child's needs without them getting upset.
- **Returning Clothes** Please return any spare clothes that your child has borrowed from school's stock, especially socks and underwear.
- Lost Property Some children are missing bobble hats, cardigans and other items from Nursery, these items have named labels. We know that children often have the same or similar items of clothing, so can we ask all parents to check that they have the correct clothing at home.
- **Wellies** Nursery: Can all parents/carers ensure all children have wellies in school, these should be in a separate carrier bag with their name on to keep on their pegs.
- Seesaw Please remember to check Seesaw every week for updates, homework tasks and what your child has been doing at school. We would be grateful if you could upload photos of your child completing activities that they enjoy doing at home, this doesn't need to be homework. This allows us to share these activities with your child and their friends.

Reading

- **Library Books** Nursery library books should be returned every Thursday, ready to be changed and handed out again on a Friday. Please see Seesaw for details of arrangements for changing library books in our Reception classes.
- **Reading Books**: The children in our reception classes are provided with a reading book and a reading record to support their phonics development. These should be brought into school every day. Please see Reception staff with any questions you may have regarding phonics.

Donations of the following items would be greatly appreciated:

- Birds- Yogurt pots, egg boxes, kitchen roll tubes and pines cones please get collecting so we can use these to make our bird feeders!
- Winter Walks Please look out for stones, pebbles, pinecones, leaves, sticks, fir tree branches etc whilst out on your travels. We would like these items to enhance our mud kitchen and playdough areas.
- **Baby Items -** We are collecting the following baby accessories e.g. nappies, bottles, rattles, baby dishes/spoons, empty wipe packets, talc bottles, sudocrem bottles etc.
- **Mud Kitchen** We would like old spoons, whisks, ladles, baking trays, tins, pots and pans, jugs, and measuring cups to use in our cooking area.
- **Clothes** Any donations of spare children's clothes would be extremely welcome for us to add to our school stock. The current weather means that children are needing to be changed more often than usual in particular SOCKS!
- **Snack money** Thank you to all parents who are giving towards our voluntary snack money each week. The money collected allows us to cook with the children and buy additional snacks for them. Donations from as little as 50p per week would be most welcome and can be handed to staff at the nursery door.
