



Applying for a School Place for September 2026

Don't forget, if your child is due to start school in September 2026, you must apply online on the Gateshead Council website (see below) by **15th January**. We have 60 places available (2 classes of 30) and places are filling up really fast. If you or anyone you know want their child to be a Lingey Duck then please apply online as soon as possible to ensure they get their place.

Winter Weather and Uniform – A Quick Reminder!

As an OPAL school, our children enjoy playing outside in all sorts of weather – puddles, drizzle and the occasional downpour included! To help them stay warm, dry and comfortable, wellies are part of our uniform list. Most families keep a pair in the class welly shed, but if you prefer not to buy two pairs, children are welcome to bring their wellies to school each day instead. At this time of year children must have wellies to access any grassed or muddy areas.

Just a little note: children **cannot wear wellies or snow boots indoors**. If they're travelling to school in them, please pop a pair of indoor shoes in their bag so they can change once inside.

It's also a brilliant idea to keep a set of spare clothes in school – **especially socks** (this applies to all ages!) You never know when a muddy adventure might happen.

Children don't need to change into wellies to play on hard surfaces so will have their usual shoes on. Please ensure these are suitable for outdoor play and will still keep feet dry.

If your child doesn't currently have wellies, don't worry. We are recycling lots of pairs in school and would be happy to provide your child with their own named set. These can't be borrowed daily, but they can be issued to keep in school. Just contact Hannah, the office or speak to your child's class teacher.
