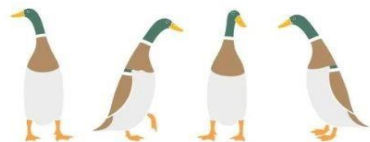
Please can all food be handed into the **Reception Office or Nursery classroom**,

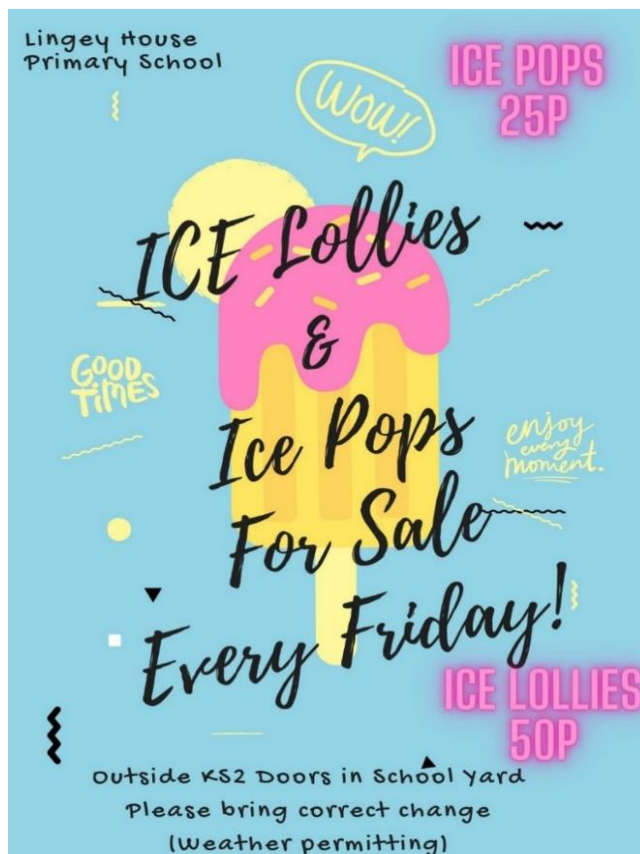
Parental Consents -Arbor
