Attendance Update

Do you know what to do if your child can't come to school?

If your child is poorly and cannot attend school or has a medical or educational appointment the school office **MUST** be notified prior to the **start of the school day**.

We have a dedicated absence telephone

line on **0191 4381287 (option 1)** where a voicemail can be left, please state your child's name, reg group and the reason why they are absent.

The school office can also be contacted on the above number and selecting option 2 (after 8am) via Arbor In-App messaging and via emailing office@lingeyhouse.org

If we have not heard from you as to why your child is absent, school will follow the procedures below:

- Ring all contacts on the contact list to ascertain the reason why child is absent.
- If no answer, call a second time.
- If no reply our Family Support Worker or a member of the SLT will carry out a home visit.
- If the door is not answered school will follow safeguarding procedures and alert the relevant authorities.

Term Time Absences

If you wish for your child to be absent for any reason other than illness an application for your child's term time leave of absence, you must fill out an application form, which can be requested from the school office. The application form asks you to outline the reasons why you feel your application for leave of absence during term time should be regarded as 'exceptional'. Following the submission of your application, you will be notified as soon as possible of the school's decision.

Holidays During Term Time

Lingey House Primary School is committed to maximising the potential of every child. You too want the very best for your child therefore good, consistent attendance at school is crucial to give your child the best chance of success. We need your support in ensuring that holidays are not taken in school time so that your child has the very best opportunity to succeed.

Our attendance target is 96% for this academic year.

Headteachers are not able to grant any leave of absence for holidays during term time unless there are proven exceptional circumstances. Therefore, as a school we have adopted a standard practice of not authorising any family holidays in term time. This is in line with government guidelines and the local authority. If parents/carers, contrary to what the school has said, still decide to take their child out of school for a holiday then the absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

If you wish to make an application for your child's term time leave of absence, you must fill out an application form, which can be requested from the school office. The application form asks you to outline the reasons why you feel your application for leave of absence during term time should be regarded as 'exceptional'. Following the submission of your application, you will be notified as soon as possible of the school's decision.

Parent/carers should be aware that if you take leave of absence during term time without making a prior application to the school, or if you make an application but your requested leave of absence is not authorised and still take your child out of school, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised. Similarly, if you keep your child away from school for longer than agreed/authorised, the excess absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

Unauthorised absences on your child's attendance record may mean that you are liable to incur a Fixed Penalty Notice or could face prosecution. A fixed penalty notice will be issued to each person with parental responsibility for the child/children who is deemed liable for the offence/offences.

Lateness

There are more and more children coming to school after the bell has gone and entering school via the main entrance. The yard doors open at 8.45am and children are expected to be in school by 8.55am at the latest. Lateness can have a huge effect on children's education. If you need any support with this, please contact our family support worker, Hannah.

School Dinner Money

If your child is in **Y3 - Y6** and has a school meal, Gateshead Council require the payment for those to be made in advance via Arbor the cost per day is £2.70 (13.50 per week).

Payments are expected in advance for all school meals. Payment should be made on Arbor propr top Monday morning to any meals required during the week. Payments can be made weekly, monthly or termly as preffered by the parent.

Library and Accelerated Reading Books

We have been in the process of updating our library inventory system so that we can keep track of all of the wonderful books we have here at Lingey House.

KS1 children have the opportunity to borrow a reading for pleasure book from our library on a weekly basis. This is then scanned out to them using a barcode located inside the book to their Library user account. Children may change their book on return of their previous loan.



KS2 children using accelerated reading books from the KS2 library also scan out their books with a barcode and user account. They can keep the book for as long as it takes them to read it and can borrow a new book on return of their previous loan. During the first half term, the children have been getting used to using the system, scanning books in and out. Now they are confident, we will soon be contacting parents for help locating any stock your child may still have on their account and a cost may be incurred if the book has been lost.

Year 4 Fire Service Visit









The Tyne and Wear Fire Service visit Year 4

Year 4 were visited by Ryan from the Tyne and Wear Fire Service. They learnt to identify fire hazards around the home, saw a science experiment about how quickly fire can spread, what to do if they see a fire and the importance of smoke alarms. The children asked many thoughtful and considered questions about Ryan's job as a firefighter.

Do you know??

- It takes less than 2 minutes for a room to be totally engulfed by fire.
- In 2 minutes, a fire will be hot enough to blow the windows out of their frames.
- If you close a door, it will give you about 30 minutes protection from a fire.
- Most house fires start in the kitchen.

If you do not have **smoke alarms** fitted in your property, the fire service will fit them for free. Call **0191 4441500** to arrange a visit and installation of smoke alarms. They save lives everyday!

Parental Consent

Please remember duck food needs to be chopped up into small pieces before feeding them ©

Our school are trying to develop the Quack Shack to make it the best we possibly can for the ducks to live but also, to make it as sustainable as possible.

If anyone would like to donate anything towards our ducks, we are looking for the following items:

- Hay bail for bedding or bags of animal bedding
- Herbs to plant in pots (living herbs or seeds) Rosemary, peppermint, chives & coriander.
- Old bags of compost, grow bags and topsoil
- Egg boxes (to allow us to collect the eggs and sell them)
- Clover and grass seed Wild bird seed & duck food
- A-frames made from wood for the ducks to hide in or tunnels

- Large troughs & large plant pots
- Fruit and vegetable seeds
- Large rocks, stones and rockery (no building materials)
- Stackers boxes and large bins to store food
- Pond plants to help clear the water
- Pond filter
- Pea gravel and stones
- Hang baskets that are empty
- Hanging plants for ducks to hide in
