We're very proud to announce that our school has achieved the **Silver Rights Aware Award** from UNICEF after our assessment this week!

This means that children's rights are at the heart of everything we do. Being a Rights Respecting School helps our pupils feel valued, heard, and respected, and encourages them to care for others and make positive contributions to the world around them.



Achieving Silver recognises our strong commitment to creating a safe, inclusive, and nurturing environment where every child can thrive. The assessor was incredibly impressed with children who spoke so well about school and their rights and what our school was like. The assessor said, 'Lingey House Primary School has a strong and nurturing foundation where children's needs are a priority.' We are very proud of our achievements so far and will continue on our rights respecting journey.
