Year One Phonics Screening Check



Can all students be provided with a sunhat, both the suncream and hat to be kept at nursery/in their nursery bag.



SEND Drop in Session

Our SEND drop-in sessions are back!

If you're concerned about your child's progress or think they may have a special educational need or disability, a chat with our SENDCo Mrs Kayleigh Watson may provide the opportunity to seek advice and support as well as making a clear plan on the next steps to support your child.



Our first drop-in session will take place during parents evenings where Mrs Watson will be available to chat with parents.

Following on from this, an informal drop-in session will be available the **first Friday of every month** starting **Friday 4th April**. No need to make an appointment! Just turn up and ask to speak to Mrs Watson any time from 2pm until the end of the school day.

- Hard boiled eggs with shells
- Seeds squash, pumpkins, tomatoes, melons, mangos, pomegranates, wild bird seed
- Greens, herbs and weeds cut grass from the garden, fresh herbs like oregano, basil, mint, calendula, parsley
- Fruits strawberries, blueberries, raspberries, watermelon, melon, pears, peaches, banana
