In recent years, children have been set homework using a grid of optional activities linked to their learning in class. From this term onwards, we will no longer be using homework grids. A small number of classes may have already sent one out for Autumn 1, but this will be the last time they are used, and—as always—these activities remain optional.

As a school, we place great importance on supporting children's learning through regular reading at home and building confidence with key skills such as times tables. Going forward, any homework will focus on these core areas. We'll be sharing details soon about the recommended and optional homework for each year group, but in the meantime, we encourage you to enjoy reading together at home as often as possible.

Yes, we said it! Christmas! We are excited to announce that this year children will have the opportunity to design a Christmas card that can be professionally printed as packs of cards or a range of personalised gifts. Because homework will no longer be shared on Seesaw, most children will not need home access. We are gradually phasing out Seesaw completely by March 2026. Some classes may continue to use it in the meantime, so if your child's class teacher sends a login, please continue to use it as directed. If you don't receive a login, you won't need one.

This document will help to identify patients who may benefit from a Pharmacy First consultation with the pharmacist and those who may need to be referred for more urgent care. Patients answering 'yes' to any of the following questions will need to be referred to the pharmacist for further support. Please note that the questions listed below are not exhaustive.


If a patient presents any of the following symptoms, they MUST be signposted to their nearest A&E department or phone 999 if there is an emergency. New confusion or disorientation

- Chest pain or palpitations
- Difficult/laboured breathing
- Pale or mottled skin
- Stiff neck




- Loss of bladder control

- Swollen lips, tongue, mouth


