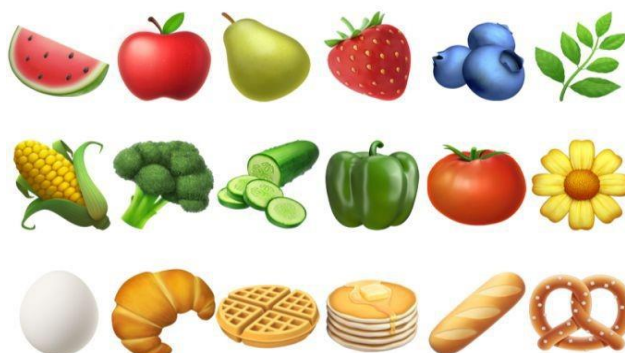
Please can all food be handed into the **Reception Office or Nursery classroom**,



Reception Parents/Carers - Opal Stay and Play Day

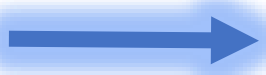

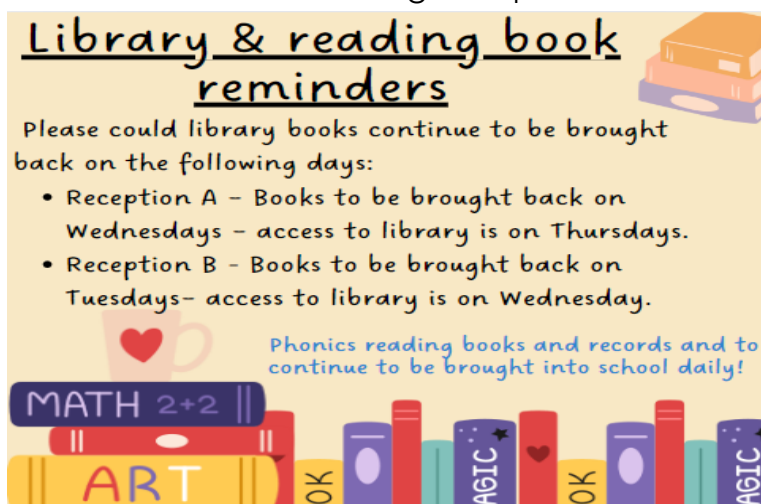
