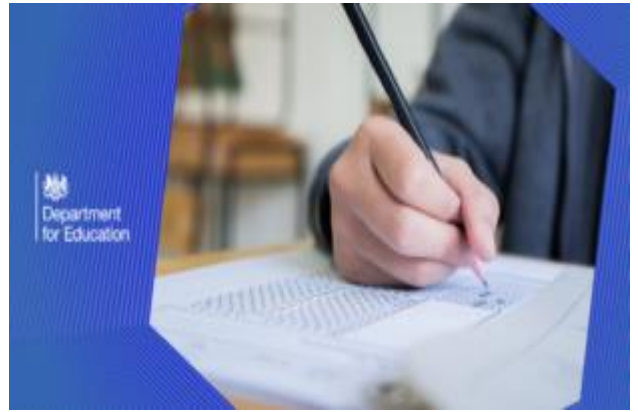
On our weekly newsletter, you will now see article numbers at the bottom of each newsletter item these will be shown in blue relating to the specific UNICEF Right of the Child.

We are very excited that we are keeping the ducklings for a few more weeks!! 😊 Please see our Facebook page for more photos.



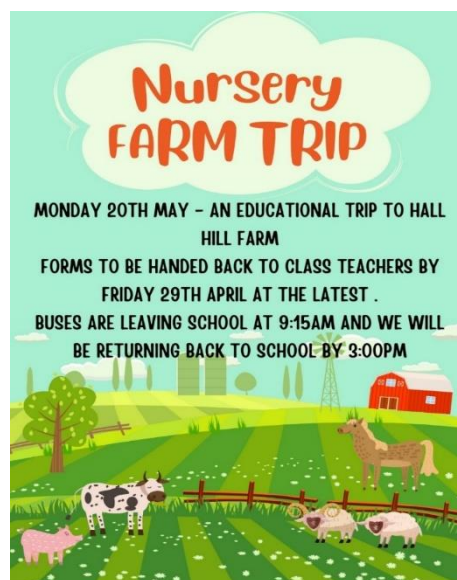


**Dates to remember:**
