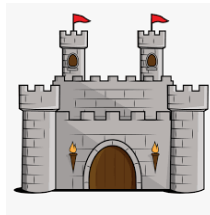

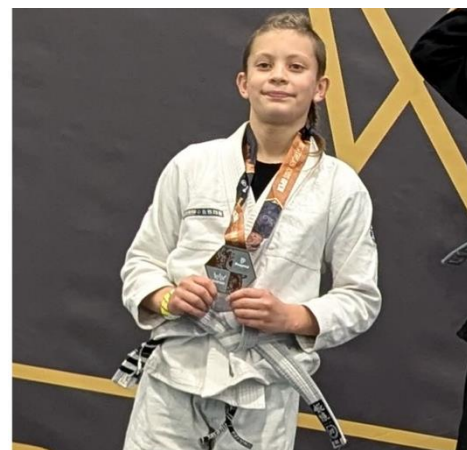


# *Out of School* Achievements
